
DESTINATION UNITED STATES



oney, money, money. Those are the first three words that enter my mind as I cross the Intracoastal Waterway to Palm Beach, Florida. To the right is a private dock stacked with mega-yachts whose size would make James Packer blush. Ahead, down Royal Palm Way, is a 25km-long island that is a holiday haven for many of the world's richest people.

It is hard to believe this area used to be an alligator-infested wasteland before oil tycoon Henry Flagler built the Florida East Coast Railway from Jacksonville to Key West in the early 1900s.

American President Donald Trump, shock-jock Howard Stern, novelist James Patterson, talk radio's Rush Limbaugh, golfers Tiger Woods and Rory McIlroy, and singers Jimmy Buffett and Rod Stewart all own multimillion-dollar homes here.

Palm Beach is Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous on steroids but despite a steady stream of Rolls-Royces, Bentleys, Maseratis and Ferraris, it feels classy and understated. The best news for tourists is the town is also surprisingly friendly and affordable.

EAT LIKE A MILLIONAIRE

The Breakers (1S County Rd), a massive 57ha oceanside resort originally built by Flagler in 1896, is a destination of choice for the world's elite. A walk through the sumptuous lobby is a must. There is a fine steak house and Italian restaurant but my pick is the trendy HMF cocktail bar and eatery. Tapas treats such as duck bao buns can be washed down with martinis with evocative names like The Redhead and Flapper's Delight.

THE PEOPLE ARE WORTH WATCHING

And Ta-boo (221 Worth Ave) is the place. This surprisingly affordable bistro, with super friendly staff, is crammed with locals every night. Try to book a table near the door so you can see the passing parade or grab a seat at the bar. Main courses will set you back about \$30 and pizzas a mere \$20. Remarkable value.

The Al Fresco restaurant (2345S Ocean Boulevard) has one of the most beautiful settings on the island - right on the beach at the Palm Beach Par 3 Golf Course. YOU CAN GET THE GOSS

Leslie Diver knows where the celebrity mansions are but, best of all, she knows the juicy gossip. One of Diver's tours is a great way to peek behind the fences of the island's exotic homes. But you also get the dirt on the scandal – affairs and even murders - that have rocked this staid

The Colony's Polo bar and eatery is next to the hotel's unique Floridashaped swimming pool. IT'S SO EASY TO EXPLORE

The best way to see Palm Beach is by bicycle or walking.

Hire a bike from the Palm Beach Bicycle Trail Shop (223 Sunrise Ave), download a map from the Palm Beach Preservation Foundation (311 Peruvian Ave) and then hit the pavement.

The North Lake Trail passes some of the magnificent homes adjoining the Intercoastal Waterway.

A trek along beachside North Ocean Boulevard is also a must. The beautiful Gothic-style Bethesda-by-the-Sea Episcopal
